Great Walstead School was founded in 1925 by Robert James Mowll in Enfield, North London (known then as Kilvinton Hall School). The School moved to its current location just outside the charming and quintessentially English village of Lindfield, Haywards Heath in 1927.

Originally, Great Walstead was founded as a boys' boarding school, evolving into a boarding and day school in 1960, with the first girls joining in 1978. RJ Mowll's dream was to provide an education where each boy would be encouraged to develop as a rounded person with religious awareness and practical skills.

Today Great Walstead is a thriving independent, co-educational school educating children from 2½-13 years of age. Situated just 45 minutes from London (by train) and within 260 acres of magnificent woodland, Great Walstead provides a unique, nurturing environment where over 460 pupils flourish both in and outside the classroom. A Great Walstead pupil is compassionate and polite, with a strong sense of values built upon a Christian foundation and, of course, adventure!
